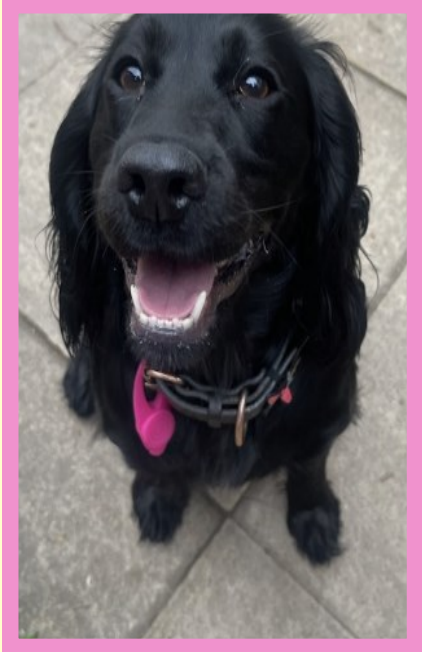

This week as geographers, **Year 3** have used maps and atlases to find out about the counties in the United Kingdom.



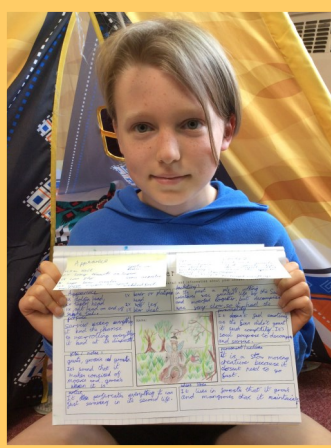
The **Nursery** children each planted a bean and a sunflower seed. They knew they needed sun and water to grow.
