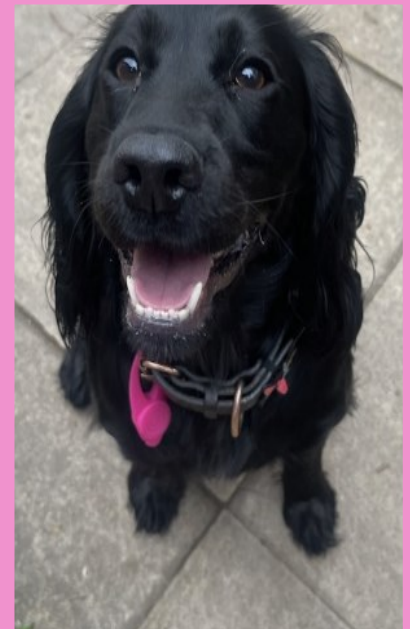

What to expect

- Warm-Up and Safety Briefing: Before each run, participants will join a fun warm-up session and a short safety briefing.
- Eye Protection: We recommend wearing goggles or sunglasses to protect your eyes from the powder. Sunglasses are available for purchase on our website.
- Limited Edition T-Shirts: Order your Allesley Primary Colour Run 2024 T-shirt online and wear it proudly!
- Medals and Photos: Every runner will receive an exclusive participant medal upon completion. Professional photos will be taken during the event and available for purchase afterward.

Important

- Who Can Participate: Open to Allesley Primary School pupils, staff, and their families. We recommend children over the age of 5 take part. All children must be supervised by an adult.
- Clothing: Wear clothes and shoes you don't mind getting stained. Light-coloured clothing shows the colours best. Children can wear their Colour Run clothing to school on 16 July.
- Facilities: Toilets and baby changing facilities will be available at the Antrim Close entrance. Note that access to the school building will not be permitted.

This week in **Reception** we have been finding out different ways to keep ourselves healthy. We have sorted foods into 'healthy' and 'unhealthy' and talked about activities that are good for us. We had a practice for sports day and knew the fresh air, being active and using our muscles was good for our bodies.

Year 2 enjoyed learning about colour mixing in Art this week.

The **Year 6** children had a fabulous trip to Cadbury World this week, where they took part in a fantastic workshop to enrich their learning about the Ancient Maya Civilization. They learned lots of interesting facts and particularly enjoyed the chocolate tasting!
