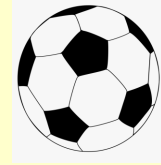
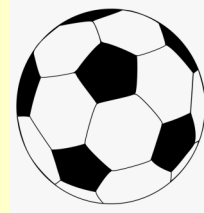

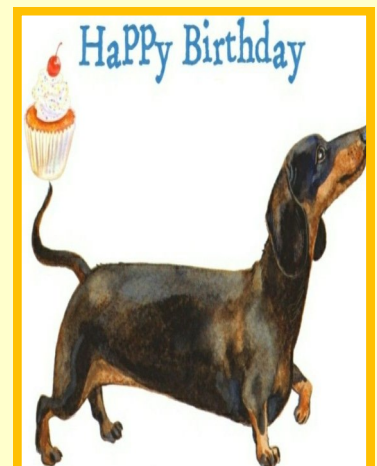

Celebrating our week



Year 6 enjoyed a wonderful visit from the 'birdman'. They learnt lots about the evolution of birds and the way they have adapted to live in their habitats.



In Year 3, we have been looking at where the Stone Age appears in our historical timeline. We learnt that it was a prehistoric time period which means before a time where history was written down.



Yesterday, Year 4 had a lovely science lesson in our outdoor learning area. We learnt about the different ways gas is produced using sparkling water, flames and balloons. With the water and balloons, we were able to weigh the amount of gas produced - which surprised us all!
