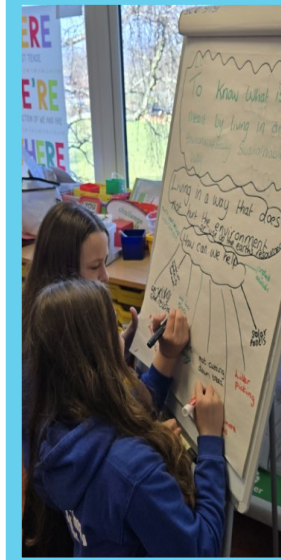

This week the **Reception** children have been focusing on Easter and what Easter is. Lesley From All Saints Church came along and shared the story of Easter with lots of fun songs and props.



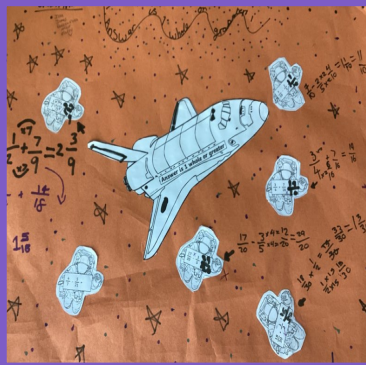
Year 6 have been thinking about what is meant by living in an environmentally sustainable way. They had to represent themselves as an action group called 'Greener Footprints' which promotes how to be more eco-friendly. They carefully considered how to present and educate their fellow council members.



Year 3 spent an afternoon outside this week, completing their stone age cave paintings. We used natural, earthy colours like they would have in the stone age.
